

## ERIK KESSELS. UN'IMMAGINE

**Gallerie d'Italia – Turin, Intesa Sanpaolo Museum**  
**From 11 September to 7 October 2025**

Turin, September 10<sup>th</sup> 2025 - **From 11 September to 7 October 2025**, Intesa Sanpaolo opens to the public the exhibition "**ERIK KESSELS. UN'IMMAGINE**" (An image) at Gallerie d'Italia – Turin, showcasing the most recent work by Dutch visual artist Erik Kessels. This is a multimedia installation that enhances the already digitized images of the Intesa Sanpaolo Publifoto Archive (over 60,000), transformed using artificial intelligence into a single, continuously evolving photograph. The result is a fluid portrait of Italy that transcends chronological storytelling: the images of people, news, and sports from the Publifoto Archive become intertwined snippets of history. In this video installation, the Publifoto Archive becomes an organic, multiform magma, revealing and dissolving the complexity of people and events that shaped Italy — a human archive projected on a monumental scale.

The immersive room of the Bank's museum in Turin becomes a visual and instrumental theatre where past and present flow seamlessly, accompanied by an original soundtrack created specifically for the project by British musician **Robin Rimbaud** (aka Scanner) and Italian electronic music composer **Stefano Pilia**.

**Michele Coppola**, Executive Director of Art, Culture and Historic Heritage at Intesa Sanpaolo and General Manager of Gallerie d'Italia, states: "The Publifoto Archive is one of the primary reasons for the Gallerie d'Italia in Piazza San Carlo and is a vast laboratory where photographs are constantly studied, restored, digitized, and presented to the public. Kessels' project, accompanied by original music, brings the protagonists and events of Italy's history to a contemporary level. When it is recounted, updated, and shared, an Archive offers an answer to the question of the role of a museum today, not only in preserving the past, but also in intercepting and exploring the present."

Erik Kessels' project represents a valuable opportunity to promote the Publifoto Archive of Intesa Sanpaolo, with free guided tours offering insights into the history of the photojournalism agency, the various types of documents housed in the archive (negatives, contact sheets, original prints, as well as registers, files, and volumes), and the stories behind the photo reports. The tours will also explore topics such as preservation, cataloguing, and the promotion of this rich heritage. Scheduled visits: 11 September at 10:30 am and 5:30 pm; 18 September at 6:00 pm; and 23 September at 10:30 am. The Turin museum, together with those in Milan, Naples, and Vicenza, is part of Intesa Sanpaolo's Gallerie d'Italia museum project, led by Michele Coppola – Executive Director of Art, Culture and Historic Heritage of the Bank and General Director of Gallerie d'Italia.

### **Erik Kessels**

Erik Kessel is a Dutch artist, curator, and communication designer with a strong interest in art and photography. Over the course of more than 25 years, Kessels has become a leading figure in the field of so-called "vernacular photography." Rather than taking new photographs, for most of his projects he assembles existing images and reuses them like tiles in a mosaic. He is an artist without a camera or lens: in his practice, photography is a pre-existing material to be sampled and recontextualised. The result is a sort of image ecosystem.

### **Intesa Sanpaolo Publifoto Archive**

The Historical Archive of Intesa Sanpaolo preserves and promotes the knowledge of documents that are crucial not only to the history of the Group but to the entire country. Among these is the Publifoto Archive, located on the third underground floor of the Gallerie d'Italia – Turin, and visible through a large glass window. The agency, founded in Milan in 1937 by Vincenzo Carrese, became a benchmark for Italian journalism, documenting news, politics, culture, and society from the 1930s through the 1980s. Acquired by Intesa Sanpaolo in 2015, the archive today constitutes an extraordinary repository of collective memory, comprising about 7 million analogue photographic images: glass and film negatives, slides, contact sheets, and prints. Thanks to the interactive installation "Archivio Vivo", this treasure has been made fully visible and accessible to the public in digital format.
